Group Residential Housing (GRH)

- GRH is 100% state-funded, administered by counties
- Individual <u>income supplement</u> to purchase "room and board" (and services in some cases)
- Goal is to prevent or reduce institutional residence or homelessness
- Over 20,000 people receive GRH each month
- •The total cost of GRH in FY2014 was \$140,000,000
- GRH is a unique income supplement in that it is not paid directly to the recipient

Eligibility FOR GRH

- Meet a Basis of Eligibility for <u>SSI</u> (over 65, blind, or have a disability as determined by Social Security Administration)
 OR
- Meet a Basis of Eligibility for GA

GA Bases of Eligibility (9/1/15)

- Permanent/Temporary Illness (medical opinion form)
- * Needed in the home to care for another person
- Requires services in residence (Professional Statement of Need)
- Women in battered women's shelters
- Unemployable (vocational assessment)
- Developmental disabilities or mental illness (medical opinion form)
- Pending application or appeal for SSI or SSDI
- Advanced age (55 or older) impacting employment
- ◆ Full-time student eligible for displaced homemaker services
- * Performing court-ordered services impacting employment
- Learning disability impacting employment
- Child under 18; emancipated, with social service plan & county approval
- * High school student age 18 and older; primary language not English
- · Drug/alcohol addiction (medical opinion form)

Eligibility: Income and Assets

- Countable Income: Less than maximum benefit
- · Assets:
- •SSI Basis of Eligibility: \$2,000
- GA Basis of Eligibility: \$1,000 (plus additional \$2,000 in Earned Income Savings account, until 9-30-2015)
- Increasing to \$10,000 June 1, 2016 (remains \$2,000 for people on SSI)

GRH Housing Rate

•GRH Housing Rate

(Room and Board, Rate 1, Base Rate, MSA Equivalent Rate)

- •\$891, eff. 7/1/15
- Rent, Utilities, Food, Household Supplies
- Anything left: Other things necessary to provide room and board
- •NOT services, clothing, medical costs

GRH Housing Requirements

- Must be Licensed or Registered
 - MN Department of Health, or
 - MN Department of Human Services, or
 - Tribal Government, or
- Pass habitability inspection (LTH)
- Providers must <u>always</u> have a GRH Agreement with their County (beds, rates, food, minimum provider qualifications, terms of payment, etc.)

Types of GRH Housing Statewide

- Adult Foster Care (4104) More than half of GRH recipients statewide live in adult foster care
- · Board and Lodge (235)
- Board and Lodge w/ Special Services (282)
- Supervised Living Facility (56)
- Non-Certified Boarding Care (16)
- · Housing w/ Services Establishment (520)
- Housing w/ Services Establishment: Homeless (372)
- Metro Demo (15)
- Tribe Certified (0)
- NEW: GRH Supportive Housing

GRH Supplemental Service Rate

- · Also known as: (Service Rate, Rate 2)
 - \$482.84, eff. 7/1/13 (or higher if Legislature authorized exception)
 - Supportive Services (required)
 - Assistance with Transportation
 - Arranging meetings and appointments
 - Arranging medical and social services
 - Medication reminders
 - Up to 24-hour supervision
 - Health Supervision (optional, requires nurse on site)

Eligibility for GRH Service Rate

- Only if ineligible for waiver or PCA services
- Must have illness or incapacity which prevents them from living independently in the community and requires services in the residence
- Professional Statement of Need signed by qualified professional or county designee

GRH Supplemental Service Rate

- Board and Lodge only and Adult Foster Care settings are not eligible
- Moratorium on new service rates, unless...
 - Banked Beds, or
 - · Legislative exception, or
 - GRH Supportive Housing

GRH Supportive Housing


- Qualified shelter stay is no longer required
- Verification of <u>long-term homelessness</u> at application
 - Use MN Housing LTH verification form
- Verification of <u>Coordinated Entry</u> assessment to need supportive housing at application
 - Coordinated Entry "receipt" when applicable
- Habitability Inspection Form, and
- Professional Statement of Need

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Professional statement of need

- DHS "Professional Statement of Need" will replace the GRH Service Plan to:
 - · Establish a GA/GRH basis of eligibility, and/or
 - Authorize a supplemental service rate (Rate 2)
- Must be signed by a "Qualified Professional" or a designee of the county
- · Reviewed annually to maintain eligibility

Professional statement of need

- County designee
 - May be available when a Qualified Professional isn't
 - •Things to keep in mind
 - Optional appointment by county
 - Use should be based on client's best interest
 - Not meant to be a "gatekeeper"
 - List maintained by DHS

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
Application


- Required to apply for other programs for which they appear eligible
- •Interim Assistance Agreement
- SOAR/SSI advocacy
- •Good Cause exception

Client obligation

New uniform earned income disregard

- GRH Recipients with a GA basis of eligibility who earn income will keep the first \$65 they earn each month, plus half of the rest of their earnings.
- This is the same disregard that people on SSI/SSDI get if they earn income.
- Takes effect October 1, 2015
- Asset limit changes (April 2016)

NEW BUDGETING/REPORTING PERIOD

- •Six-month budgeting and reporting period for GRH recipients with GA basis of eligibility:
 - GRH benefits based on estimate of future earned income
 - Increase in earned income does not increase client obligation
 - Report decreases in earned income immediately
 - Earned income reported on Household Report Form every six months, report other changes within 10 days
 - Changes will take effect April 2016

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GRH Payments

- Pre-Pay
- Issued at the beginning of an eligibility month
- Post-Pay
 - Issued after the end of an eligibility month
 - Required when:
 - Residence is expected to last 30 days or less
 - Clients are monthly reporters

Absent Days

Continue GRH payment for up to 18 days per absence, not to exceed 60 days per calendar year

- · County approval required unless...
- No county approval required when crisis, illness, or injury

Concurrent Eligibility

- General Assistance (GA)
 - Common to get both GA and GRH
 - •GA grant changes from \$203 (community) to \$97 (GRH settings)
 - If a person loses GA eligibility, they don't lose **GRH** eligibility
 - Personal Needs Allowance would be allowed in GRH Budget, but not paid out on EBT

Minnesota Supplemental Aid (MSA)

- Monthly cash supplement to Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payment
- Average monthly caseload of 30,000 people receiving MSA in 2012
- •Over 75,000 Minnesotans between the age of 18 & 65 receive SSI

MSA Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for MSA a person must be:

- Over age 18 (or under 18 and blind), and
- Receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI),
- Would be receiving SSI except for excess income. If not receiving SSI must be:
 - · Age 65 or older, or
 - · Blind, or
 - Disabled

MSA Monthly Benefit

(individual)

(MSA=\$111 for couples) (additional \$ for special needs)

MSA Special Needs

 Special Diets CM 23.12 • Restaurant Meals CM 23.18 Guardian/Conservator Fees CM 23.15 • Representative Payee Fees CM 23.21 Home Repairs CM 23.06 • Household Furnishings & Appliances 23.09

 Housing Assistance CM 23.24 MSA Housing Assistance Eligibility

- ■A person must:
 - •Be eligible for MSA, and
 - •Be under age 65 (grandfathering allowed), and
 - Have monthly shelter costs in excess of 40% of gross monthly income, and
 - · Apply for rental assistance, and

MSA Housing Assistance Eligibility

 Be <u>relocating from institution</u> (hospital, RTC inpatient services, a nursing facility, or an ICF-DD) or an intensive residential mental health treatment program,

or

- Eligible for self-directed MA PCA services, or
- Be <u>receiving waivered services</u> (CAC, CADI, BI, DD) in their own place

MSA Housing Assistance Benefit

\$733 (SSI FBR)

+ 81 (MSA)

+194 (MSA Housing Assistance)

\$ 1008 Total Income

 + Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

MSA Housing Assistance

- ■Recipients can choose where they live no "licensed or registered setting" requirement
- •They can use the money in whatever way they choose
- •Great tool to assist people who want to live in a less restrictive setting (leaving nursing homes, group residential housing, intermediate care facilities, prison, etc.)

Application

- Combined Application Form (CAF) or applies online at <u>www.applymn.org</u> w/required verifications (income, assets, etc.)
- Phone interview is ok, <u>in-person interview</u> not required
- Counties recertify eligibility at least once every 12 months
- Individuals have 10 days to report changes that affect eligibility
